Snapshot of Baltimore City Schools of Choice - Spring 2009 For all City Schools included in the Spring 2009 MD Report Card

- 39 Schools of Choice, 21% of the City's Schools
- 11,094 Students, 14% of the City's students
- 11% of students in choice schools are special education students
- 14% of students in Baltimore are special education students
- 69% of students in choice schools receive free or reduced price meals, the same as for the system as a whole

For Elementary School Students

- 19 Schools of Choice, 15% of the City's Elementary or Elementary Middle Schools
- 4,599 Students, 12% of the City's elementary students
- 9% of elementary students in choice schools are special education students
- 13% of elementary students in Baltimore are special education students
- 61% of elementary students in choice schools receive free or reduced price meals
- 70% of elementary students in Baltimore City receive free or reduced price meals
- 329 average number of elementary school students per school, lower than for all city elem schools (410) and the non contract schools (425)

For Middle School Students

- 26 Schools of Choice, 27% of the City's Middle or Elementary Middle Schools
- 3,084 Students, 18% of the City's middle school students
- 13% of middle grade students in choice schools are special education students
- 18% of middle grade students in Baltimore are special education students
- 78% of middle grade students in choice schools receive free or reduced price meals,
- about the same as for the system as a whole (79%)
- 302 average number of middle school students per school, lower than for all city middle schools (388) and the non contract schools (419)

For High School Students

- Schools of Choice, 33% of the City's High or Middle High Schools
- 15 Schools
- 3,411 Students, 14% of the City's high school students
- 15% of high school students in choice schools are special education students, the same as for city high school students
- 70% of high school students in choice schools receive free or reduced price meals
- 61% of all high school students receive free or reduced price meals
- 285 average number of high school students per school, lower than for all city high schools (541) and the non contract schools (665)
